2018-2019 Position Available: Lower School Librarian & Technology Teacher

Capital City Public Charter School is seeking a dedicated and talented Lower School Librarian and Technology Teacher.

The Lower School Librarian and Technology Teacher will report to the Director of Library Services and the Lower School Principal, and will also work closely with the Library Assistant, Middle School Technology Teacher and High School Librarian to support students in developing age-appropriate information, media, and technology skills.

This is a 10-month position, which is exempt and therefore not eligible for overtime pay under the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act.

The many and varied responsibilities of this role will include:

- Planning and teaching technology and library classes for students in grades PK-4
- Utilizing a workshop model to differentiate instruction and promote engagement
- Collaborating with teachers to develop technology-rich learning expeditions, and project-based learning
- Designing curriculum maps to sequence the teaching of content
- Regularly assessing student progress and using data to plan for instruction
- Meeting and planning regularly with the Arts & Fitness team, as well as the Library Services team.
- Developing a strong classroom culture through the Responsive Classroom® model
- Communicating regularly with families
- Collaborating with staff and students to implement consistent structures and develop traditions at our school
- Attending a summer institute and weekly professional development sessions
- Sharing non-classroom responsibilities (such as staffing the library desk, organizing student events, planning meetings) with the rest of the staff.

Requirements:

At least two of the following are **required**: Advanced degree in library science, preferably with a certification in school library media, and/or equivalent combination of education and experience; 2+ years of full-time teaching experience; standard teaching certification. Candidates must be extremely knowledgeable about teaching technology to elementary school students. Candidates must possess a deep knowledge of current children's literature and

educational media. Candidates should also have: strong collaboration skills, a commitment to meeting the needs of a diverse population, experience working in urban environments, strong knowledge of pedagogy and experience teaching in a constructivist way, comfort with a project-based curriculum proven ability to work as a member of a team, strong leadership capabilities, and a commitment to their own learning.
