High School Biology Summer School Teacher

Capital City is looking for a dedicated and talented High School Biology Summer School Teacher.

This is a 5-week summer position, June 25-July 25 with 2 -planning days allocated and July 4th off. This position is exempt and therefore not eligible for overtime pay under the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act.

The many and varied responsibilities of summer high school teachers at Capital City include:

- Planning/teaching daily classes for 15-25 students taught in two time blocks- 9-11:45am and 12:15-3:00pm.
- Utilizing a workshop model to differentiate instruction and promote student engagement
- Regularly assessing student progress and using data to plan for instruction
- Meeting and planning at least twice with the summer school principal
- Supporting students with completing projects and meeting passage requirements of course
- Completing progress reports mid-way and at the end of the summer

Qualifications: At least two of the following are <u>required</u>: Bachelor's degree in education or field of instruction, 2+ years of full-time teaching experience, standard teaching certification. Secondary teachers must also have an undergraduate or graduate major in their field of instruction OR have passed the required Praxis II exam for their discipline. Additionally, candidates should have: a commitment to meeting the needs of a diverse population, experience working in urban environments, strong knowledge of pedagogy and experience teaching in a constructivist way, proven ability to work as a member of a team, strong leadership capabilities, and a commitment to their own learning.
