## **High School History Teacher**

Capital City is looking for a dedicated & talented High School History Teacher for the 2019-2020 school year. Capital City serves a diverse population and seeks a teaching staff reflective of our student body.

This is a 10-month position, which is exempt and therefore not eligible for overtime pay under the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act.

The many and varied responsibilities of High School teachers at Capital City include:

- Planning/teaching daily classes for students within a modified-block schedule (Class sizes-18-20 students)
- Content knowledge base to teach World History I/II, <u>US History</u>, American Government/Economics, DC History, Human Geography, and/or African-American and Latin American Studies
- Utilizing a workshop model to differentiate instruction and promote student engagement
- Developing learning expeditions, curriculum, and projects
- Regularly assessing student progress and using data to plan for instruction
- Meeting and planning at least weekly with a grade-level team and co-teacher (if applicable)
- Serving as an advisor to 12-13 students that involves leading a daily advisory, helping to develop the social curriculum, and supporting advisees through regular parent communication
- Collaborating with staff and students to implement consistent discipline structures and develop traditions at our school
- Involving students in fieldwork and service that deepens understanding and interest
- Supporting students with completing portfolios and meeting passage requirements
- Attending a summer institute and weekly professional development sessions
- Completing narrative progress reports and report cards
- Certification to teach AP courses is highly desired

**Qualifications:** At least two of the following are <u>required</u>: Master's degree in education or field of instruction, 2+ years of full-time teaching experience, standard teaching certification. Secondary teachers must also have an undergraduate or graduate major in their field of

instruction OR have passed the required Praxis II exam for their discipline. Additionally, candidates should have: a commitment to meeting the needs of a diverse population, experience working in urban environments, strong knowledge of pedagogy and experience teaching in a constructivist way, proven ability to work as a member of a team, strong leadership capabilities, and a commitment to their own learning.
