2019-2020 Position Available: Middle School Drama Teacher

Capital City Public Charter School is looking for a drama teacher for our middle school campus. The drama teacher is responsible for developing and implementing a curriculum for 5th-8th grade students that aligns with national arts standards. The drama teacher will work closely with the visual arts and music teachers (as well as the rest of the staff) to achieve the mission and goals of Capital City. Capital City serves a diverse population and seeks a teaching staff reflective of our student body.

Responsibilities of the Drama Teacher include:

- Planning and teaching weekly drama classes to 5th-8th graders (class sizes: 22-25 students)
- Creating and sharing organized, high quality weekly lesson plans and curriculum documents
- Working with classroom teachers to support learning expeditions and the individual needs of students.
- Meeting and planning regularly with the specials team.
- Communicating with parents through newsletters, narrative report cards and (as needed) meetings.
- Sharing non-classroom responsibilities (such as lunch duty, CREW leadership, organizing student events, planning meetings) with the rest of the staff.

At least two of the following are <u>required:</u> Bachelor's degree <u>and</u> at least <u>one</u> of the following:

- A major in education or field of instruction or equivalent 30 semester hours of credit
- District of Columbia teaching license in field of instruction
- Two years of verifiable teaching experience as a teacher of record
- One year as a support teacher at Capital City and enrollment in a teacher education or certification program.

While the above are the minimum qualifications, Capital City seeks to employ experienced, credentialed teachers. Ideal candidates have a Master's degree and 3+ years of full-time teaching experience. In addition to the above requirements, teachers must meet the requirements of all hires at Capital City including a criminal background check, and a negative TB test.
