## GPA (Grade Point Average) = Quality Points (Qty. Pts) /Total Credits Earned

To calculate GPA, divide the total number of Quality Points by the total number of Credits Earned. For semester classes or classes valued at .5 credits, multiply the number of credits earned by the number of Quality Points earned.

Example: A Fitness class taken for one semester is valued at .5 credits. If a student earns a 4 in that class, when calculating the GPA, 2 Quality Points (4 x .5) are added into the equation. For a full year Biology class valued at 1 credit, a student earning a 3 will receive 3 Quality Points.

## Honors Designation (H)- 0.5 Quality Point weight increase

For calculation, students will receive an additional .5 Quality Points added for Honors courses.

Example: For an Algebra 2 Honors class, a student earning a 4 will receive 4.5 Quality Points for calculating their GPA.

## AP Designation (AP)- 1.0 Quality Point weight increase

For calculation, students will receive an additional 1.0 Quality Point added for AP courses.
