

We hold our students to high standards. To graduate, 12th graders must pass a rigorous capstone project, Senior Expedition, that involves a 10-12 page research paper and a 50-minute panel presentation.

Counseling and support is core to our model. We employ three full-time counselors, including a College Counseling and Alumni Associate, who ensure students receive the services needed to succeed through college. College counseling begins in 9th grade to help students and their families navigate the application, financial aid, and enrollment process. We facilitate college visits and fairs, internships, and study abroad trips. Other experiences such as our Financial Aid Retreat for families, College March to the Mailbox, and Senior Seminar focused on college preparation, result in students feeling prepared to get to, and through, college.
